





**Fig 3. Safe operating area; continuous and peak drain currents as a function of drain-source voltage**



**Fig 4. Transient thermal impedance from junction to mounting base as a function of pulse duration**










**Fig 8.** Normalized drain-source on-state resistance factor as a function of junction temperature





**Fig 9. Gate-source threshold voltage as a function of junction temperature**





**Fig 10. Sub-threshold drain current as a function of gate-source voltage**





**Fig 11. Forward transconductance as a function of drain current; typical values**




**Fig 12. Input, output and reverse transfer capacitances as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values**




**Fig 13. Transfer characteristics: drain current as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values**



**Fig 14. Gate-source voltage as a function of gate charge; typical values**




**Fig 15. Source (diode forward) current as a function of source-drain (diode forward) voltage; typical values**





**Fig 16. Drain-source clamping voltage as a function of drain current; typical values**



**Fig 18. Source-gate clamping current as a function of source-gate clamping voltage; typical values**




