SiliconMAX standard level N-channel enhancement mode Field-Effect Transistor (FET) in a plastic package using TrenchMOS technology. This product is designed and qualified for use in computing, communications, consumer and industrial applications only.











Fig 4. Transient thermal impedance from junction to mounting base as a function of pulse duration





Fig 5. Output characteristics: drain current as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values





Fig 8. Gate-source threshold voltage as a function of junction temperature




Fig 10. Normalized drain-source on-state resistance factor as a function of junction temperature



Fig 11. Gate-source voltage as a function of gate charge; typical values







Fig 14. Package outline SOT404 (D2PAK)
