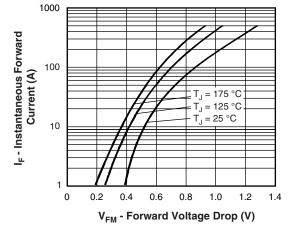


Fig. 1 - Maximum Forward Voltage Drop Characteristics (Per Leg)

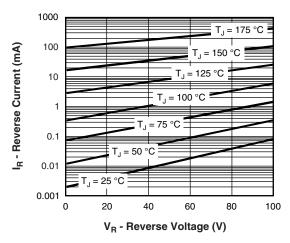


Fig. 2 - Typical Values of Reverse Current vs. Reverse Voltage (Per Leg)

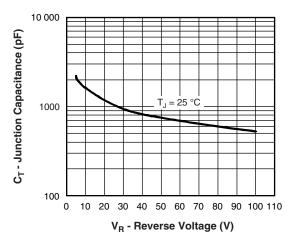


Fig. 3 - Typical Junction Capacitance vs.Reverse Voltage (Per Leg)

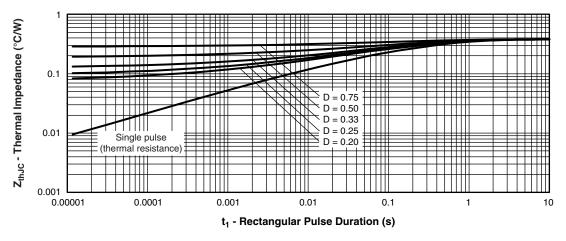


Fig. 4 - Maximum Thermal Impedance Z<sub>thJC</sub> Characteristics (Per Leg)

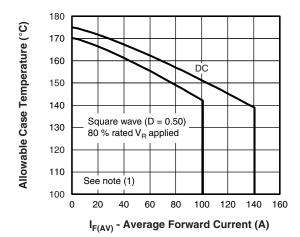


Fig. 5 - Maximum Allowable Case Temperature vs. Average Forward Current (Per Leg)

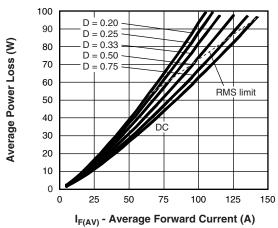
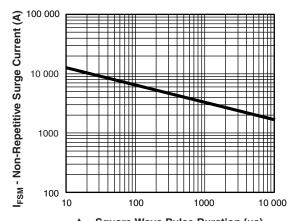


Fig. 6 - Forward Power Loss Characteristics (Per Leg)

Fig. 7 - Maximum Non-Repetitive Surge Current (Per Leg)

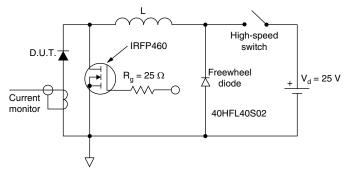


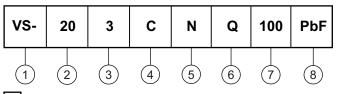
Fig. 8 - Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit

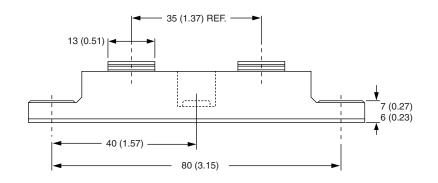

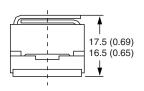

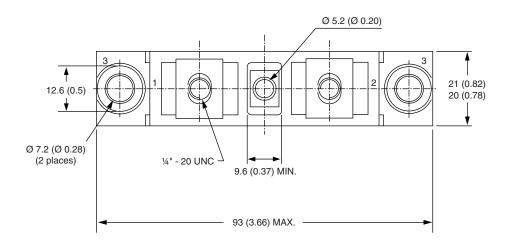
