

MP2696A Evaluation Kit (EVKT-MP2696A)



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Overview

Introduction

The EVKT-MP2696A is an evaluation kit for the MP2696A, a highly-integrated, single-cell Li-Ion/Li-Polymer battery charger with a pass-through power path management function. Its layout accommodates most commonly used capacitors. The default function of this board is preset for charger mode, and the full-charge voltage is preset to 4.200V for a single-cell, Li-lon battery.




Figure 1: EVKT-2696A Evaluation Kit Set-Up

Section 1. Hardware Specifications

1.1 Personal Computer Requirements

The following minimum requirements must be met to use the EVKT-MP2696A:

- Operating system of Windows XP, 7, or later
- Net framework 4.0
- PC with a minimum of one available USB port
- At least 22.2MB of available memory

1.2 EV2696A-Q-00B Specifications

1.3 EVKT-USBI2C-02 Specifications

The EVKT-USBI2C-02 refers to the communication interface, which connects the EVB to the PC and its supporting accessories. When used with the MPS Virtual Bench Pro and I²C GUI tools, this kit provides a quick and easy way to evaluate the performance of MPS digital products. Section 2. Software Requirements

2.1 Software Installation Procedure

Programming occurs through the MPS I²C GUI. Follow the instructions below to install the software:

Note: This software can be downloaded from the MPS website on the EVKT-MP2696A product page.

- 1. Download and extract the zip package titled "I2C evaluation kit software for MP2696A."




Figure 4: MPS I²C GUI Set-Up Guide

- 2. Double click the .exe file to open the software (see Figure 4).
- 3. Follow the prompts in the set-up guide.
- 4. Wait for the status screen to verify that installation is complete (see Figure 5).

Section 3. Evaluation Kit Test Set-Up

3.1 Hardware Set-Up

The hardware must be properly configured prior to use. Follow the instructions below to set up the EVB:

- 1. Locate the proper wires to connect the EVB to the EVKT-USBI2C-02 communication interface.




Figure 6: EVB to MPS USB Communication Interface Wire Connection

- 2. Connect SCL, SDA, and GND (see Figure 6). Refer to the MP2696A datasheet for further clarification.

3.2 Powering Up the EVB

- 1. Connect the positive and negative terminals of the load to the SYS (TP5) and GND (TP6) pins, respectively.
- 2. Connect the positive and negative terminals of the battery to the BATT (TP1) and GND (TP2) pins, respectively.
- 3. If it is a battery simulator, preset the battery voltage between 0V and 4.45V, then turn it off.
- 4. Connect the battery simulator output to the BATT and GND pins, respectively.
- 5. Preset the power supply output between 4.5V and 6.0V, then turn off the power supply.
- 6. Connect the positive and negative terminals of the power supply output to the VIN (TP3) and GND (TP4) pins, respectively.
- 7. Ensure the battery voltage is present (if a battery simulator is used, turn on the battery emulator).
- 8. Turn the power supply on. The IC automatically enters the power-on sequence.

Reminder: If the battery simulator is connected, turn on the battery emulator before the input supply in the start-up sequence.



3.3 Software Set-Up

After connecting the hardware according to the steps above, follow the steps below to use the GUI software:

- 1. Start the software. It will automatically check the EVB connection.




Figure 7: USB Communication Interface and the MP2696A EVB Show as Connected

 - If the connection is successful, both the USB and MP2696A demo board statuses will appear as "Connected" in green (see Figure 7).

- If not, they will appear as "Disconnected" in red. Check the connections between the EVB, the communication interface, and the PC. Re-plug the USB into the computer.
 - MP2696A demo board: "Disconnected" means the evaluation board is not connected correctly.
 - USB: "Disconnected" means that the USB I²C communication interface is not connected correctly.
- 2. Click the "Read All Register" button to read the I²C register values. The default values are displayed (see Figure 7).
- 3. Find the item to be changed, and select the desired value from the drop-down menu.
- 4. Click the "Write All" button to update the values. The new information will be downloaded to the IC.
 - $\triangle \square$ All changes made via the ℓ^2 C are restored to default values once the EVB powers down.



3.4 Device Programming Instructions

The MP2696A-xxxx is an OTP part. Follow the instructions below to create and export customized configurations:

- 1. Open the MPS GUI software using a computer.




Figure 8: Select OTP

- 2. Select "OTP View" in the toolbar (see Figure 8).

3. Enter a new table (see Figure 9). The parameters highlighted in red can be changed.

4. Select values from the drop-down menus. Ensure all the parameters are populated before selecting "Export" in the toolbar. Click "Export" to export the configuration (see Figure 10).




Figure 11: Saving Configurations as a .txt File

5. Find a location for the exported file, and click "Save." The configurations are saved in a .txt file (see Figure 11).

6. Send the file to an MPS FAE to apply for the customized "xxxx" code.

3.5 Troubleshooting Tips

EVKT-USBI2C-02 Driver Problem

If the USBI2C-02 driver is not properly installed, manual installation is required. Follow the steps below:

Note: Check the driver version. Find "USBXpress Device" in the Device Manager under USB controllers.




Figure 12: Correct Driver Version is 4.0.0.0

Right-click to view Properties. If the PC is running Windows 10, check to make sure the driver version of matches the newest version. Windows 10 may automatically install an outdated USB driver that is not compatible with this product. The correct driver version is 4.0.0.0 (see Figure 12).

1. Install the correct ".exe" file according to the Windows operating system.

Choose either the 32-bit or 64-bit operating system.

32-bit: \EVKT-USBI2C-02 USB Driver\USBXpressInstaller_x86.exe.

64-bit:\EVKT-USBI2C-02 USB Driver\USBXpressInstaller x64.exe.

2. Connect the I²C communication interface to the PC with the USB cable.

No Supply

The IC's input pin has an under-voltage lockout (UVLO) detection circuit. If the input voltage (V_{IN}) is below the UVLO rising threshold, the charging function is disabled.

No Charging Event

If the IC detects that the input voltage is below the UVLO falling threshold (enter no supply state) or overtemperature protection is triggered (enters shutdown state), the IC switches to supplement mode powered by the battery.

Thermal Recovery

If the MP2696A is in a shutdown state due to the die temperature exceeding the thermal protection threshold, the IC powers on again once the die's temperature decreases.
